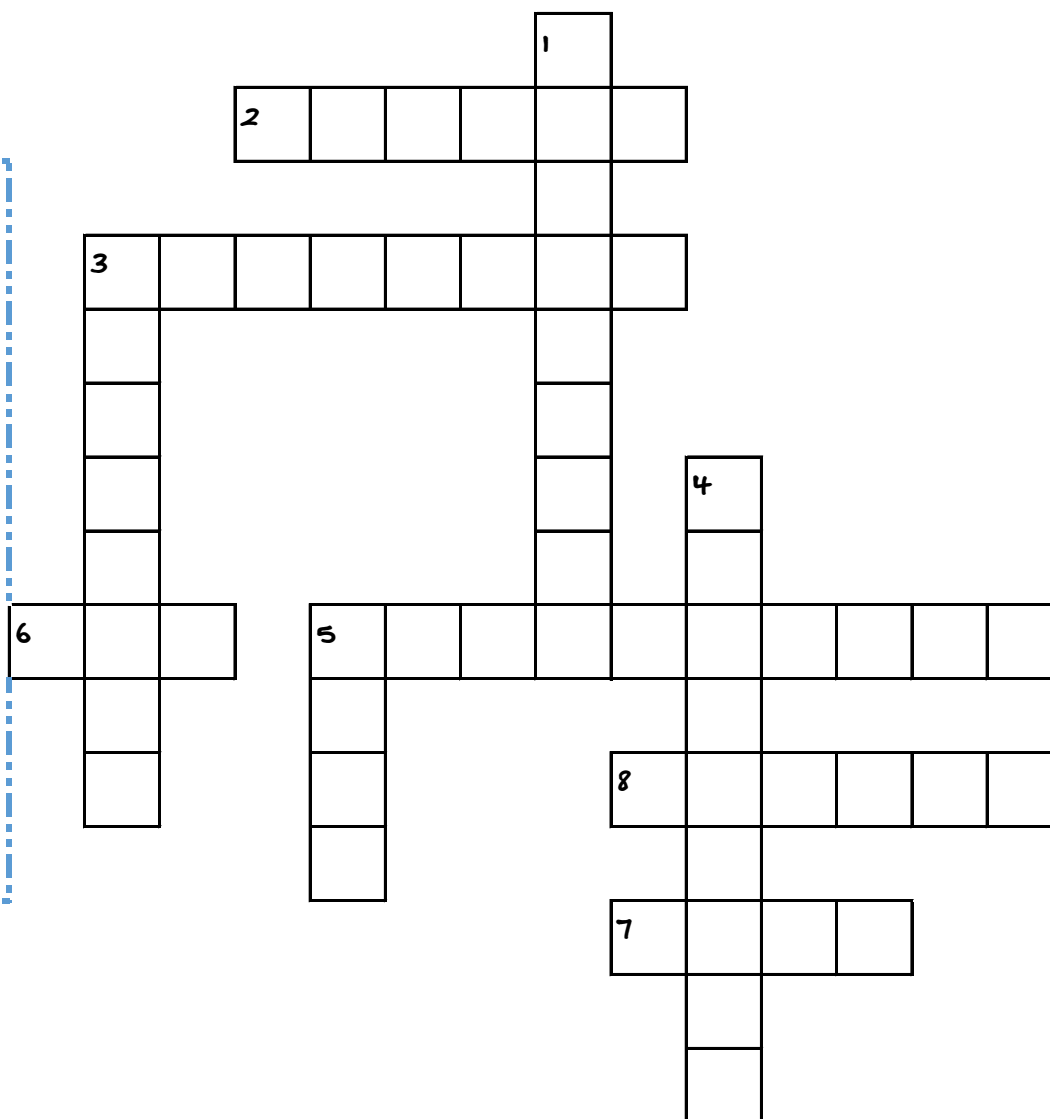

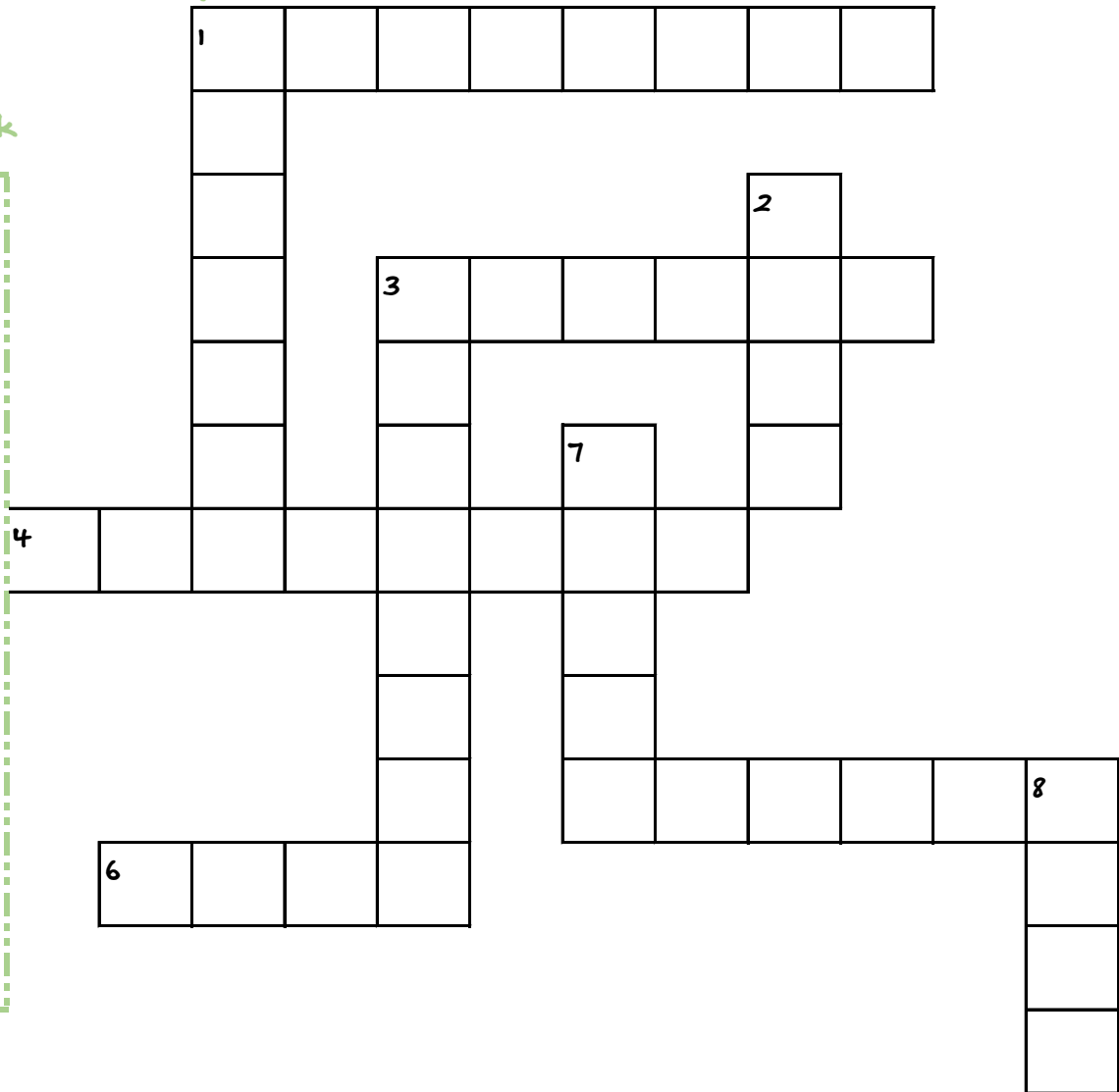

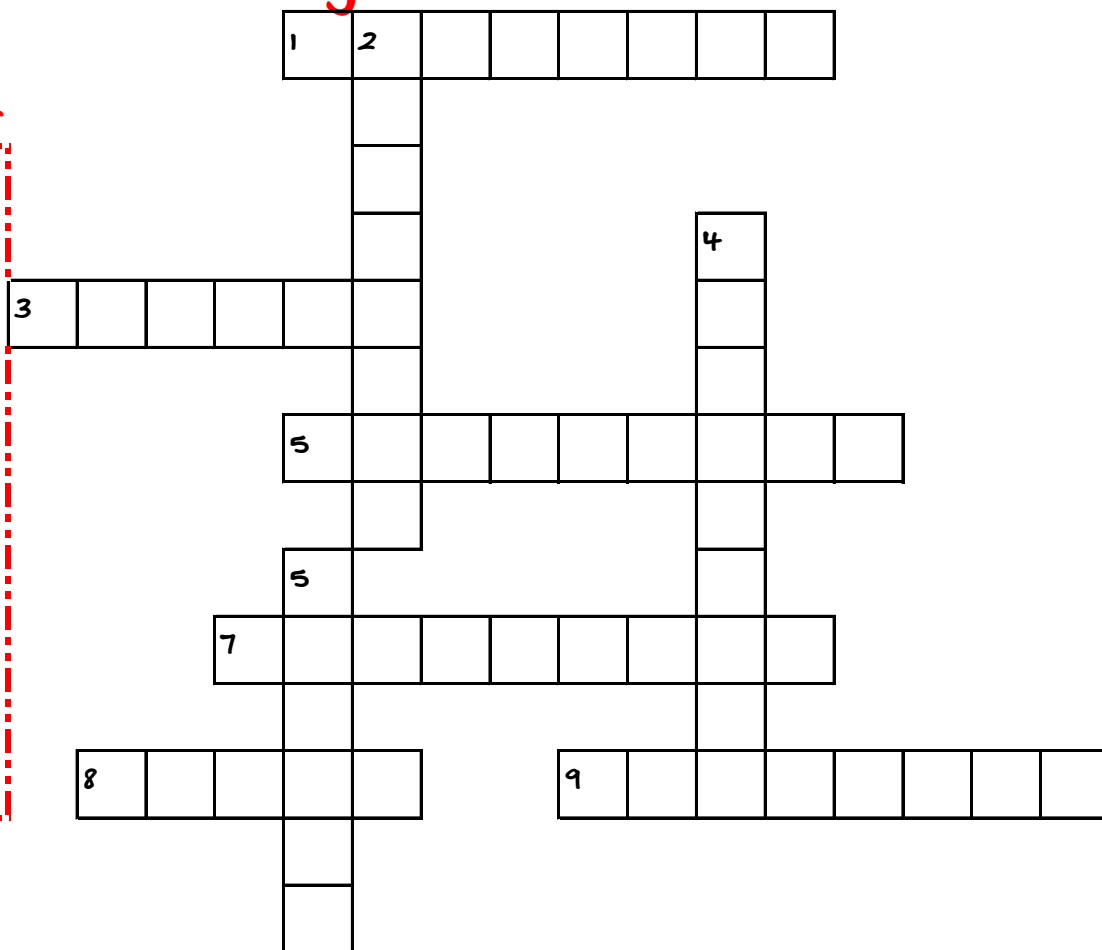

Alcohol Ink Tile Instructions



Supplies Needed:

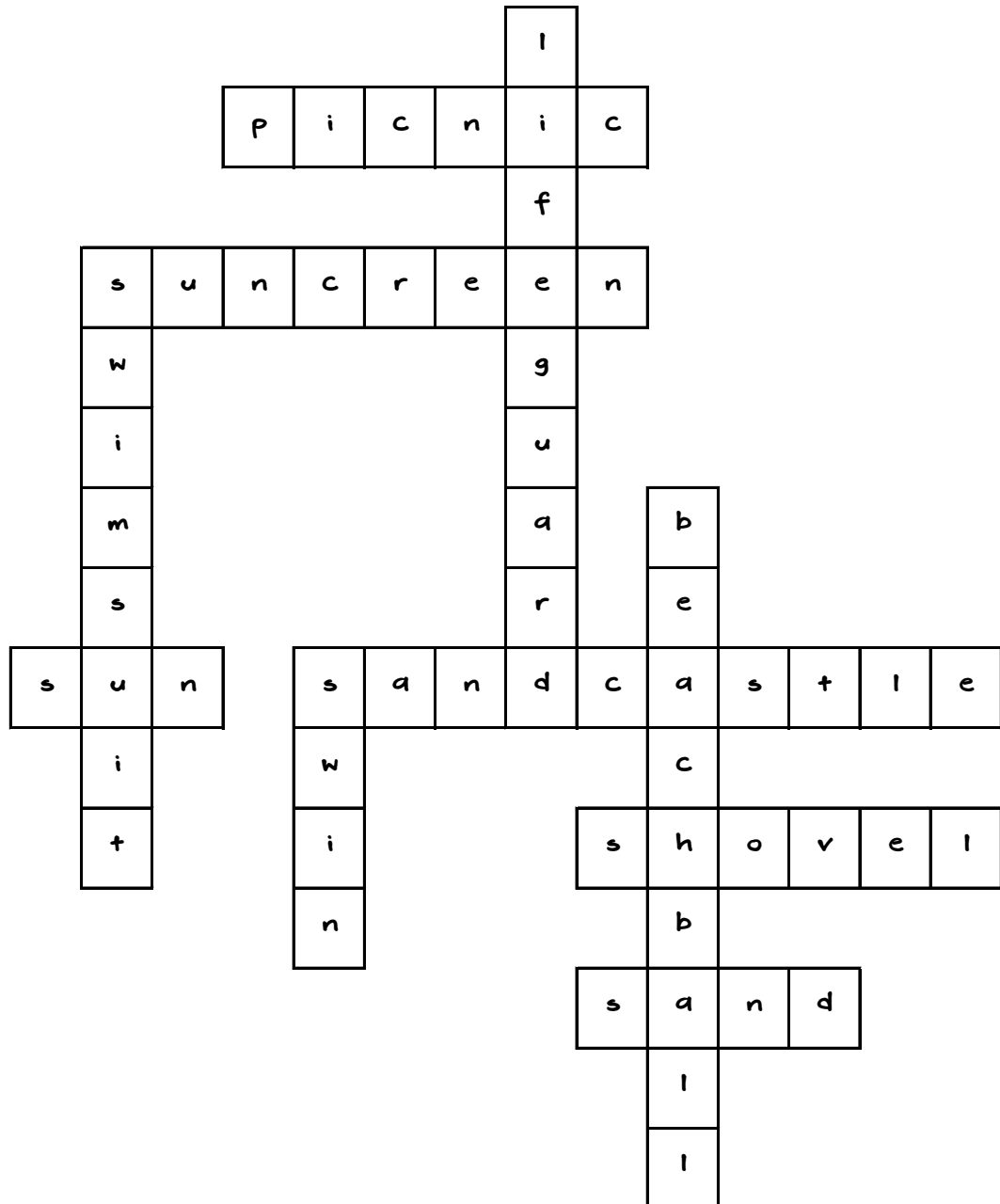
- White 4" x 4" porcelain tiles
- Sharpies (lots of colors!)
- Rubbing alcohol (poured into a small spray bottle)

Directions:

1. Place a tile on paper towels
2. Color your tile with any colors you want – you can color in blocks of colors or patterns or pictures – get creative!
3. Spray a light layer of rubbing alcohol all over the entire tile. (**ask an adult for help, if you need it)
4. Pick the tile up and tilt in different directions so that the ink starts to spread.
5. If you like what it's doing, keep doing it.
6. If you want the colors to run more, you can spray more rubbing alcohol
7. When you like what you have, lay the tile down flat on the table and blow on it to encourage the ink to dry and stop spreading.
8. Let your tile dry before carrying it around
9. Attach felt to the back and seal with Modge Podge if you want to use your tile as a coaster or give as a gift!

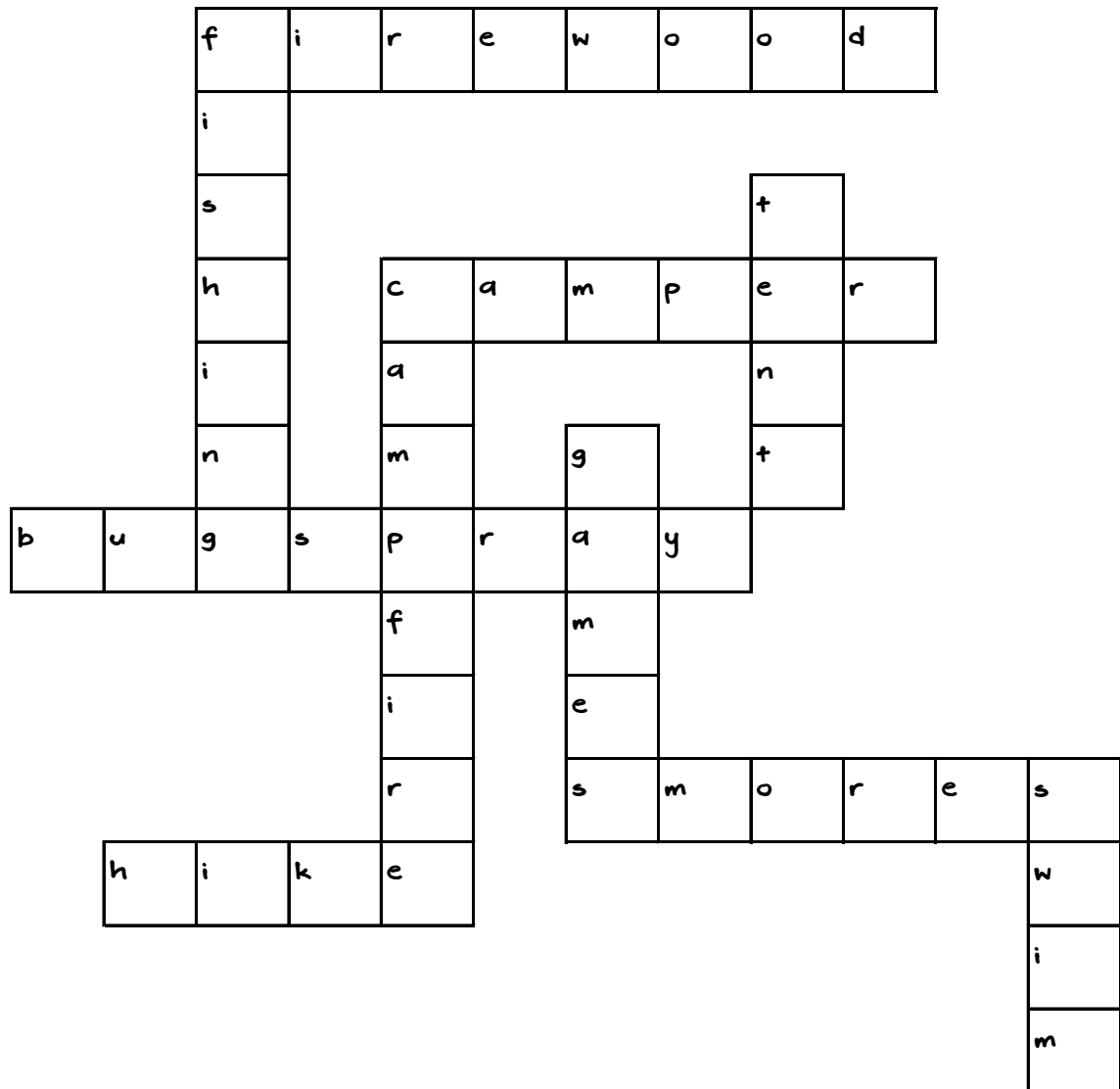

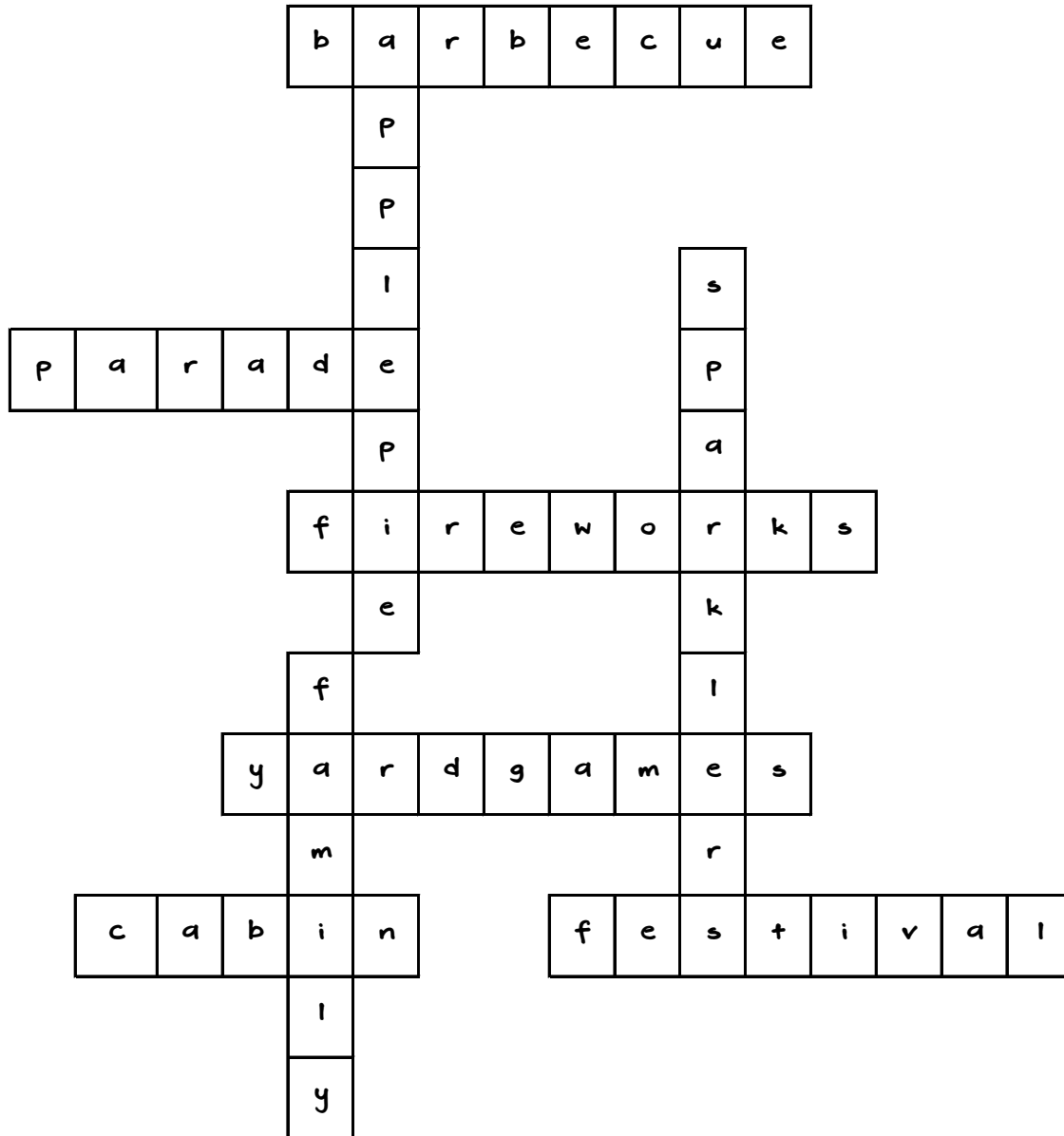

4th of July Word Problems

ANSWERS

1. Dad bought sparklers for the kids to play with at the neighborhood 4th of July block party. There are 6 families that plan to attend the party, including Angie and Erica's. If each family attending has 2 kids and dad promised 3 sparklers for each kid, how many sparklers will they need?

$$6 \times 2 = 12$$

$$12 \times 3 = 36 \text{ sparklers}$$

2. Austin and Zach are attending 2 BBQ's on the 4th of July. One in the afternoon and one in the evening. In the afternoon their dad and mom both had a hamburger and a hotdog, the boys both had 1 hot dog each. In the evening dad and mom both had a hot dog, while Austin and Zach had one burger each. How many hot dogs and hamburgers did the family eat?

	1 st BBQ	2 nd BBQ
Burger	2	2
Hot Dogs	4	2

$$2 + 2 = 4 \text{ Hamburgers}$$

$$4 + 2 = 6 \text{ Hot Dogs}$$

3. Valery went to the farmer's market with her grandmother and bought 50 apples. She will be helping her grandmother bake 6 apple pies for their families 4th of July celebration. If grandma's recipe calls for 8 apples in each pie, are there enough apples for Valery to have one for a snack? Explain your answer.

$$6 \times 8 = 48 \text{ apples needed for the pie}$$

2 will be left over, Valery can have one for a snack and there will still be one left over.

Beach Day Word Problems

ANSWERS

Jackson and Lilly have had a busy day at the beach. Jackson built 6 sand castles, each with a mote. Lilly built 7 of her own sand castles, each with its own flag. How many castles did they build all together?

$$6 + 7 = 13$$

Mom ask Sara to pack enough beach towels and water bottles in the beach bag so that everyone in her family has one, plus the giant beach blanket. Sara, her sister, two brothers, mom and dad will all be going to the beach today. How many items will Sara need to pack in the beach bag?

$$6 + 6 + 1 = 13$$

Bill is working at the beach selling ice cream today. When he got to the beach he had 20 ice cream bars, 15 bomb pops, and 15 lemon freezes available to sell. So far he has sold 3 ice cream bars, 5 bomb pops, and 2 lemon freezes. How many items does Bill have left for sale?

$$20 + 15 + 15 = 50$$

$$3 + 5 + 2 = 10$$

$$50 - 10 = 40$$

Or 17 ice cream bars, 10 bomb pops, and 13 lemon freezes
